Welcome to the Seaman's Institute Course Catalog of US Coast Guard and NY/NJ State Courses. Civilians please proceed to State Boater, Career Night, Ordinary Seaman, and Apprenticeships below. Sailors, School Policy statements are followed by Courses Descriptions then Enrollment information. (718) 447-7717 is Staffed Daily 10-1500 (GMT+4) with Live Site-Navigation Assistants.

All are welcome to register and observe any class for Free; however, the time will not count toward any Seaman's Institute Certificates. Some of our listed courses await their final approval from the governing Agencies, so please check that status as you review your Course's information. FYI: Many descriptions include "Recommended Reading" to ease your studies and some show "Application Package Contents" listing the documents and things required by the issuing Agencies.

Students are responsible for ensuring that their desired Course meets their specific needs and/or licensing requirements, so each Agency's exact Authorization Statement is included with most course descriptions as it will read on your Seaman's Institute Course Completion Certificate. Most find reassuring our live and FREE: Career, Licensing, and Academic guidance, which is available from our Director of Admissions, Captain Ed Schultz (718) 442-5171. Capt. Schultz can also help you prepare a properly completed USCG & State Application Packages that gets you all License you are qualified for - Call: Mariner Assistance Program (MAP) 203-400-5321.

Fleets and groups of five or more individuals (see Our List & you) qualify for special-scheduling. For Individuals, our Academic Calendar shows the Dates of the fixed-series of Wheelhouse, Engineroom, Deck and Galley program Courses which you can join, and all readers will find a typical schedule rotation described within each Course Description. This School can shift dates.

The Agencies set a maximum capacity for each class. We recommended that you get onto the Call List for the courses and dates you want. Enrolling well ahead of time allows any group of four or more sailors to Qualify any Class, and once a class is declared "Qualified" if We is cancel it you get a 101% Tuition Refund. Some lectures may be conducted off-campus. A typical day is 0800-1800. NY/NJ State & U.S.C.G. attendance requirements apply to all Certificated Courses.

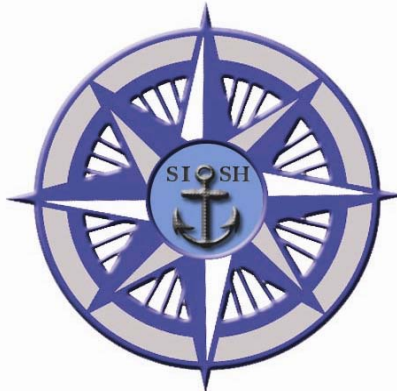
